Community sign process ready!


A long-awaited process by which Bayfront neighborhoods can buy harmonizing community signs has crossed its final hurdle, the Bayfront Advisory Commission was told at its last meeting.

The application process was developed by the city's Public Works Department and the BAC over several years. This applies to signs placed in the city right-of-way. They must be endorsed by the civic association or league or community group seeking the sign and must be paid for with private funds.

In return, the city will install the signs at no cost to the applicant and they will become city property.

Earlier plans for this sign program had to be reworked because of a Supreme Court decision that held that governments could regulate the appearance of signs but not their content. The signs may be up to 10 feet tall, with a surface area no greater than 7.85 square feet. Each sign will have two readable sides and will be positioned so that both sides can be seen along the city's right-of way. Each community is limited to one sign unless it is bisected by Shore Drive, in which case, a total of two will be permitted.

For unity, the signs will all have a white field and black letting/graphics. The guidelines suggest that the graphic be the live-oak image that is in use along the Bayfront. That image is available from the Public Works department, the city's web site or the Bayfront Advisory Commission's web site. Guidelines also recommend that applicants bring proposed designs to the BAC for review.

Voting deadlines loom

Registration deadline for the Nov. 8 general election is Monday, Oct. 17 at the close of business. That is also the deadline for filing for change of address. Requests for mailed absentee ballots will be accepted until Tuesday, Nov. 1. Online voter registration is available at the Virginia Department of Elections web site at www.vote.virginia.gov.

Courthouse Fire Station, Building 13, Municipal Center, Oct. 24- Nov. 5, Monday-Friday, 8a.m.-5 p.m., Saturdays, 10 a.m.-2 p.m.

- Ronald H. Williams Jr. has been hired as deputy city manager for economic vitality. He will oversee the departments of Planning and Neighborhood Development, Housing and Neighborhood Preservation, Agriculture, Convention and Visitors Bureau, Cultural Affairs Office, Economic Development and the Aquarium and Museums. Williams will fill the vacancy created following Doug Smith's recent departure beginning Nov. 7. Deputy city manager in Norfolk since 2012, he manages the planning and infrastructure areas and has also overseen Economic Development, General Services, Human Resources and Information Technology. He also worked for Norfolk from 2002-10 in various capacities, including director of Budget Management and Grants and special assistant to the city manager.
